#### **Role Summary:**

- To lead specialist dietetic team in providing an effective specialised dietetic service for patients within a specific clinical area.
- To have a responsibility to line manage and supervise a team of dietitians and assistants
- To act as a source of expertise and support to other dietitians and other healthcare professionals including medical staff, AHP's, Pharmacists, Nursing staff.
- As a highly experienced autonomous practitioner to assess, request diagnostic tests and treat patients within his/her own case load of in and/or out-patients.
- To provide education and training to doctors, nursing staff, dietitians, students and others as appropriate to the role.
- To be responsible for developing and co-ordinating dietetic student placement programmes.
- To drive local policy development in relation to clinical specialty

#### **Clinical Responsibilities**

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- To act as an expert, evidence based resource for the nutritional treatment of this designated patient group, advising on complex specialist feeding methods in order to optimise treatment outcomes
- To act as clinical lead in this area for other team members and the wider department
- To carry a complex clinical caseload within this specialty and ensure nutritional intervention is delivered in an effective, timely and cost-effective manner, taking into account medical, biochemical, pharmacological, social, psychological ,environmental and cultural factors.
- To be an active member of the multidisciplinary team in this designated area, attending meetings and ward rounds as appropriate
- To undertake comprehensive assessment of patients including those with
- diverse or complex presentations/multi-pathologies in order to formulate individualised management and treatment plans
- To be able to accurately calculate nutritional requirements for highly complex conditions and devise feeding/dietary regimens to meet these requirements.
- To assert autonomous clinical judgment where expert opinion differs due to an ambiguous or absent evidence base.
- To apply advanced clinical reasoning skills and assessment techniques in the planning and implementation of complex and specialised therapeutic interventions eg intravenous feeding regimens
- Where appropriate, to undertake anthropometric measurements to assess and monitor nutritional status.
- To deal empathetically with patients who are facing long-term complications and/or the terminally ill.
- To communicate effectively and comprehensively with staff, patients and carers from a range of sociocultural backgrounds, including those with disabilities, to ensure understanding, co-operation, compliance and consent.
- To facilitate safe and timely patient discharge and to monitor outcomes of dietetic intervention
- To monitor and review dietetic care plans within the specialist field against a diverse range of outcome measures and adjust care plans to facilitate achievement of goals.
- To participate in emergency cover as required.
- To develop evidence based clinical protocols and pathways of care in conjunction with the multidisciplinary team.



#### Managerial/Organisational

- To be responsible for a designated area of work; working efficiently and cost effectively with regard to patients' management and use of resources.
- To appropriately determine priorities according to patient-related, professional, departmental and trust demands and goals.
- To be responsible for ensuring suitable and cost effective selection and use of resources.
- To delegate aspects of patients' treatment programs to less senior registered staff, dietetic assistants and under- graduate students as appropriate
- To liaise with MDT colleagues within UHSM and externally to ensure safe discharge and suitable provision of ongoing treatment.
- To provide managers with specialist advice on planning and development in relation to the specialist service.
- To provide leadership within the trust by representing Dietetics on relevant specialist groups and working parties
- To support the development and delivery of dietetic student placement programs, including teaching, assessment of performance, feedback, coaching and formal assessment. To delegate aspects of clinical placement to less senior staff and to oversee staff who provide under-graduate education.
- To take a lead role in the development and implementation of (local and national) policies and services within the Department and the Trust in relation to this specialist area of dietetics.
- To be responsible for the line management of a team of dietitians and assistants, with involvement in recruitment and CPD in line with Trust policy and as directed by the Head of Dietetics.
- To engage in appraisal and performance management of team members, in line with Trust policy.
- To provide support to less senior staff who may need emotional support and empowerment to manage change effectively.

#### Documentation

- To be responsible for maintaining accurate and comprehensive records of assessment and treatment in line with British Dietetic Association national standards and local UHSM policy.
- To record and submit clinical activity data in accordance with departmental standards and collate information on designated team performance as requested by the Head of Service.

#### **Clinical Governance**

- To maintain his/her competence to practice at a highly specialised level and to meet professional and Health Professions Council clinical requirements for registration.
- To comply with the Heath and Care Professions Council standards and rules of professional conduct.

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- To undertake ongoing personal development, as determined in conjunction with the Head of Dietetics, in line with the Trust Appraisal Policy.
- To maintain and further develop requisite specialist skills and knowledge e.g. through reflective practice, in-service training, formal and informal training / courses and Specialist Clinical Interest groups s.
- To undertake Trust and local mandatory training.
- To ensure high clinical standards and evidence based practice within the profession and the designated specialty by teaching at an under-graduate and post-graduate level to dietetic students locally and regionally and to other health professionals (including Consultants) within UHSM and more widely.
- To design and undertake audit/research within the specialist clinical area and coordinate audit and research within team.
- To gather and analyse data from research projects, clinical audits, quality assurance standards etc. in line with the service/team clinical governance agenda and to implement any changes in practice arising out of such work.
- To critically analyse research papers and other relevant data on new treatment techniques and to apply such knowledge/techniques appropriately within this specialist area in order to improve patient care and outcomes.
- To comply with National and Local policies, guidelines, standards and requirements and to advise the Head
  of Dept regarding pertinent changes to national guidelines/legislation within this specialist field e.g.
  NSF/NICE.
- To develop local evidence based policies and protocols in relation to this specialist area.
- To comply with UHSM Risk Management policy and undertake risk assessments in the designated clinical area, informing line manager and agreeing and implementing an action plan



#### **Effort and Environment skills**

**Physical effort**: Transport of record cards, anthropometric and home enteral feeding equipment, non-stock supplements and record cards from the dietetic office to ward/outpatient clinics as required.

**Mental Effort**: Frequently required to spend up to one-two hours concentrating whilst collating, assessing patient information and developing a care plan and while analysing audit information and producing reports and documents.

Able to work with frequent interruptions and review workload priorities several times a day to deal with changes in service demands.

**Emotional Effort**: Involved with the care of terminally ill and critically ill patients on a day to day basis, dealing with stressed and emotional patients, relatives and carers.

**Working conditions**: can often be unpleasant e.g. dealing with body fluids, soiled linen and unpleasant smells and sights.
